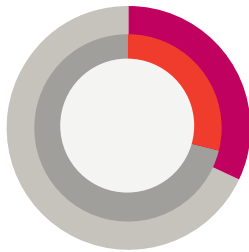

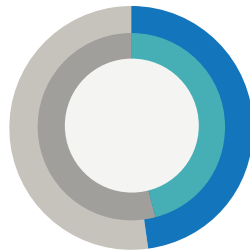
NEW HAMPSHIRE SENATE PRIMARIES

■ 46% (9) Winners

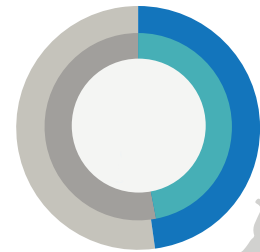
NEW HAMPSHIRE HOUSE PRIMARIES

GOVERNOR

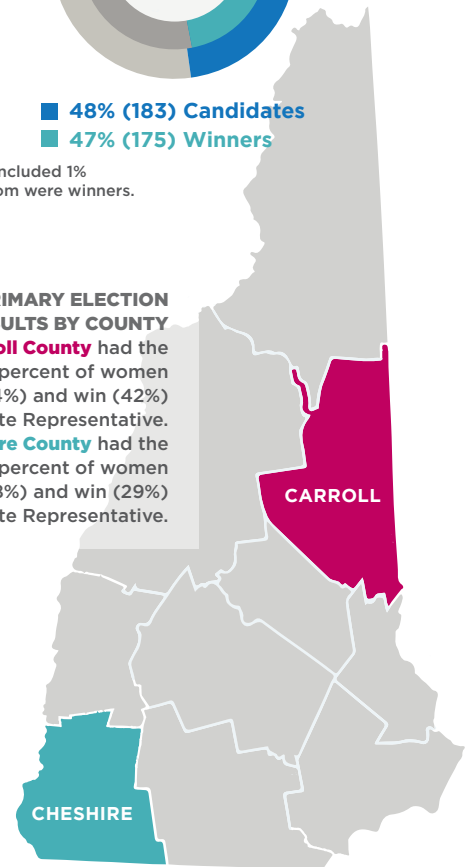
For the first time in NH history, both major party candidates for Governor, Joyce Craig (D) and Kelly Ayotte (R), are women, ensuring the top position in the state will be held by a woman.

NEW HAMPSHIRE'S SECOND CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT

For only the second time in NH history, both major party candidates for a US Congressional seat are women: Maggie Goodlander (D, NH-02), and Lily Tang Williams (R, NH-02).

PRIMARY ELECTION RESULTS BY COUNTY

Carroll County had the highest percent of women run (44%) and win (42%) for State Representative. **Cheshire County** had the lowest percent of women run (28%) and win (29%) for State Representative.

COUNTY SHERIFF

Two women, Kathryn Mone (D-Strafford County) and Jillian Myers (D-Grafton County), won their primaries for County Sheriff. There has been a woman appointed to Sheriff in New Hampshire history, but none have ever been elected to the position.

FOOTNOTES

1. The research team determined candidates' gender based on the totality of the available evidence, including such evidence as gender information available in the roster of current elected officials; names; photographs; and use of gender-specific pronouns in campaign websites, social media accounts, and other online sources.
